## Senior Jackets Junior Sweatshirts

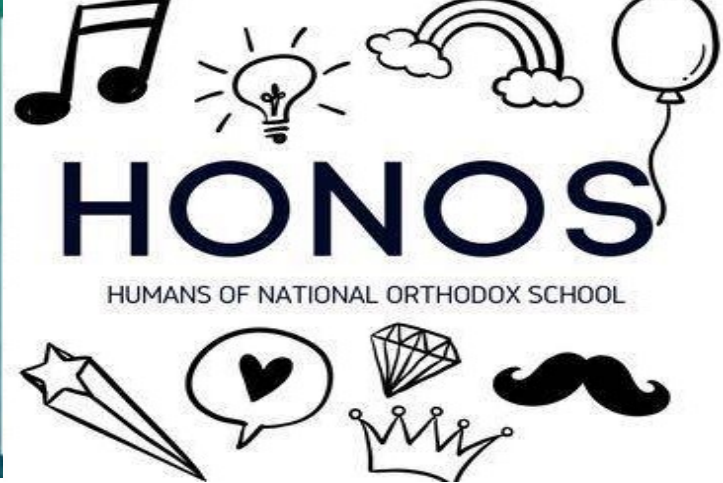

## HONOS - High Achievers

Our humans of NOS for this issue are some of our High Rank Achievers:

**Farah Ashqar:** *"When it comes to studying, I believe in the importance of quality over quantity. The IGCSE journey is not an easy one but never allow it to take over your lives. As overwhelmed by academics as you may be, don't stop doing what you love to do. Keep your hopes high, getting a rank is not as far-fetched as you think it is."*

**Anton Naber:** *"When solving past papers, I time and grade myself because I write a lot and tend not to finish in time, and a low grade would encourage me to work faster the next time. Although I procrastinated a lot for most of the semester, in these last few weeks I became incredibly efficient. I gave myself regular breaks between papers and I did on average 4 to 5 papers a day in A-Level. My advice for students is: Do study well for the mock and distribute your studying over two or more weeks."*

**Omar Fakhoury:** *"IGCSE ranks are very challenging to say the least. They demand long hours of hard work and concentration, but honestly the most effective strategy in my opinion is solving as many past papers as possible and familiarizing yourself with the mark schemes. Always aim for the top. I truly believe that a strict studying schedule is not as important as focusing on every little detail while preparing for your exams."*

**Natalie Barakat:** *"Like everything else in the system, it requires a lot of hard work, not only from your part but from the teachers' part as well. I was always interested in everything that the Arabic language has to offer so having to get creative with my writing was something I loved to do instead of had to do. Keep the motivation going, whether it was the results day or your own determination, it helps, and never forget: The first person who should believe in you is you."*

**Jude Najjar:** *"It definitely needs someone who is willing to work, not just at home but also at school. My advice to current students is that they shouldn't worry too much about exams or stress over it; if they put in the effort and give it their best, then hopefully they'll get the grades that they want."*

**Ghada Khoury, IGCSE Math Teacher:** *"The most rewarding part in teaching is seeing my students get ranks and pass their exams with distinct degrees. I believe that teaching them is one thing, but I feel that I can reach beyond that by being their guide and friend. Teaching is what I like the most, I don't think of it as a job, it is what I do best and enjoy."*

The National Orthodox School's MUN club has been vastly successful over the years, whether it be due to holding engaging conferences, winning a large number of awards, or proving itself in other continents such as Europe.

Throughout November and December 2016, before the NOSMUN conference, the MUN schedule was filled with conferences such as ASGMUN, IMUN and AMMUN.

### ASGMUN

The school's presence at ASGMUN was a noticeable one, with 50 student participants comprised of 5 chairs, 44 delegates, and 1 student supervisor. Not only were we the largest delegation among other schools at ASGMUN, but our students also

managed to outperform other delegations by earning a breathtaking and outstanding 15 best delegate and runner up best delegate awards across 9 committees, making this the largest number of awards received by the school at a conference this year.

There are still conferences to attend, however, and that accolade could be broken!



### I'MUN

This conference managed to attract the attention of our younger delegates who are part of the Junior MUN department of the club (headed by Omar Fakhoury). Nineteen students participated as delegates, 16 of which were part of the Junior MUN, and 1 student participated as a chair. Our young delegates debated passionately and professionally, and were able to hold themselves in front of older, more experienced delegates. Ali Sartawi earned a best delegate award and received high praise from the chairing panel, whereas our older delegate Mohammad Al-Sheboul got a runner up best delegate award.



### AMMUN

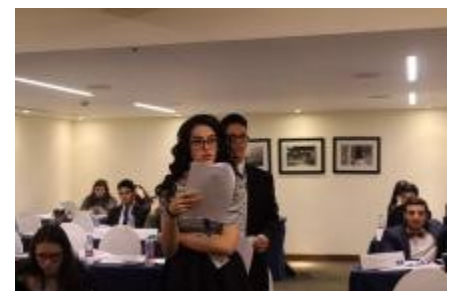
It is the only THIMUN affiliated conference in Amman, this fact got the attention of 6 of our students, 5 of which participated as delegates and 1 as the chair of the International Court

### **Tara Abboud as Lady Gaga:**

“Redrella gave me the chance to do what I love for a whole week, it was like a dream that passed so quickly because we were enjoying each moment of it. Redrella built strong bonds between me and my colleagues in the drama club; we shared special memories together.

### **Saleem Madaeen as Sir Snail:**

“Redrella was my first piece of acting, and I was extremely lucky to get a role that actually affected the twist of the plot which, quite frankly, means a lot to me .

But apart from the work itself, and how hard we all worked, what has been the highlight of my time in the drama club was the team working on it. People close to me whom I got closer to, and people I don’t know whom I’ve had the honor and pleasure to meet. نظمت لجنة التوعية الوطنية والقومية في مدرستنا سلسلة من الأنشطة لجميع الصفوف من 1-12 في ذكرى وعد بلفور. وتراوحت الأنشطة من سرد تاريخ الوعد على شكل قصة للطلبة في الصفوف 1-3 ثم الطلب منهم إلصاق ورق الزيتون على خارطة فلسطين، إلى المحاضرات للصفوف 4-12، بالإضافة إلى لعب الأغاني الوطنية في الساعات على مدى أسبوع ووضع عبارات "وعد من لا يملك لمن لا يستحق ... فلسطين لنا" في ممرات المدرسة. وتمّ تناقل خبر مبادرة الوطنية الأرثوذكسية اشميساني عبر صفحات التواصل الاجتماعي والفيسبوك. كما أقام قسم التربية الفنية في المدرسة معرضاً فنياً



بعنوان (أرفض وعد بلفور بالواني) يوم الخميس الموافق 24/11 في قسم النشاط، كجزء من فعاليات ذكرى الوعد وكان الطلبة قد قاموا بانجاز الرسومات خلال حصص الفن، تجسّيداً لوعيهم وقدرتهم على التعبير عن رفضهم لتاريخ رسم نفسه واقعا أمامهم. يذكر أنّ وعد بلفور هو الاسم الشائع المطلق على الرسالة التي أرسلها آرثر جيمس بلفور بتاريخ 2 نوفمبر 1917 إلى اللورد ليونيل ولتر دي روتشيلد يشير فيها إلى تأييد الحكومة البريطانية لإنشاء وطن قومي لليهود في فلسطين.
