

In March 2018, NOS became an IB World School, accredited to teach the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP). Our school will begin offering the IBDP choice for Grades 11 and 12 students starting next school year, 2019-2020. But NOS has already opened classes for the IBDP Foundation Year program, this year, for Grades 9 and 10 students. Raman Othman explains a bit about the Programme and shares her experience so far.

IBDP at NOS: So What Exactly Is the IB? -Raman Othman

"The IB Diploma Programme (DP) was established to provide a challenging and comprehensive education that would enable students to understand and manage the complexities of our world and provide them with skills and attitudes for taking responsible action for the future. The IB focuses attention on the values and outcomes of internationally minded learning described in the IB learner profile. IB learners strive to become inquirers, knowledgeable, thinkers, communicators, principled, open-minded, caring, risk-takers, balanced and reflective. These attributes represent a broad range of human capacities and responsibilities that go beyond intellectual development and academic success. Learning communities become more inclusive as they identify and remove barriers to learning and participation. Commitment to access and inclusion represents the IB learner profile in action." —IB.org

IB Foundation Years students at NOS (Grades 9 and 10) are currently working on enhancing and obtaining their Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills alongside the IB learner profile attributes in hopes of becoming well-rounded students, well-equipped for their upcoming IBDP years (Grades 11 and 12).





IB Orientation

On Saturday, September 1, 2018, the first IB orientation was held in our beloved NOS. Parents, students and teachers (of both Grades 9 and 10) came together to meet all their new teachers, as well as to take a look into their new classrooms, in addition to a Q&A session held at the end to answer any questions. The session was organized by the IBDP Coordinator Ms Alice Haddad with assistance and cooperation from IB teachers and the Grade (9-12) Stage Administration.





A Look into Our IB Classrooms!

In both Grades 9 and 10, there are resource libraries, filled with a wide and diverse selection of books and references for each subject. Placed on the walls are student projects and creative outputs of self-expression. Our boards are always decorated to correspond with the unit or project that we are working on; for instance, one of our Grade 10 English units was about gender roles; thus, as part of our 2nd month assessment, we were assigned to decorate our designated English board as we wished. As part of our IB curriculum it is vital to participate in many teamwork activities. Therefore, Grade 9 students put work in their Chemistry class in order to discuss the topic at hand. In Garde 10, alongside the board decoration, students were assigned to write and present a speech about the topic of gender roles for their English class. In order to grasp the concept of formal public speaking and making speeches, Grade 10 students had the opportunity to stand on a podium as they presented.

The IBDP students held a fundraising event in observance of International World Heart Day. CIS REaccreditation

CIS Reaccreditation

Earlier this September, it was pretty well known that the CIS was planning a visit to our school's campus; thus, naturally much buzz was going around. Even though there was a number of CIS visits to our school, still, there was curiosity circling their visit and its purpose this time.

Who Is the CIS and Why Did They Visit?

CIS stands for "The Council of International Schools". It is a membership based global non-profit organization that is mainly committed to high-quality international education. The CIS accreditation is a tool used around the world, to monitor, assess, and evaluate the standards and quality of the education a student receives at school. It is a quality assurance and evaluation process to provide an opportunity to improve and verify the quality of the education offered.

NOS succeeded in getting the CIS accreditation for the first time back in 2014; it was one of the first 4 schools in Jordan to do so.

The CIS accreditation lasts a five-year span, and as our school's 5^{th} year approached, a team visit was scheduled by the CIS, in order to ensure everything was in check and up to standards. The visit lasted for a week, from the 15^{th} to the 20^{th} of September in specific.

The team visit included members of the CIS touring our school and its kindergarten, Wahbeh Tamari, in addition to meetings with Board Members of our parent organization, the Orthodox Educational Society (OES) and with the NOS leadership team, as well as multiple students, teachers and staff members.

Eco School Accreditation

In addition to the CIS re-accreditation, last year our school was awarded the Gold Level in the Healthy Schools Accreditation, based on its success in meeting the guidelines set by the Royal Health Awareness Society for a healthy, hygienic, safe school environment. But there was one more important accreditation our school set out to gain, based on its sense of environmental responsibility: Eco Schools.

Since last year our school has been working on getting the Eco Schools accreditation. At the end of last year, the Eco Schools Review Committee visited NOS. They toured the school and listened to a presentation by some students from the Environment Club. On Thursday, November15, 2018, our school officially received the Eco schools Green Flag.... Now we all have to work together to protect our school and our world environment!

What is Eco Schools?

An environmental management education program with 5100-member schools in 67 countries worldwide. It is designed for the implementation of sustainable development culture in schools by encouraging students to take a more active role in the environmental administration of their schools and houses through working in their classes, the school and the community. The program is administered worldwide by the Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE)

هكذا كان عنوان حملة سرطان الثدي لشهر تشرين الأوّل/أكتوبر ٢٠١٨، الذي بنى من خلاله طلبة المدرسة الوطنية الأرثوذكسية عملًا كان ممتلئاً بالحياة. بدايةً كانت الآراء كثيرة، ولكنّ الفكرة والهدف واحد؛ ممّا جعلنا نحن كطلبة نجتمع على الإبداع. كان أكبر اهتمامات الطلبة جمع التبرعات من خلال بيع بعض المنتوجات لمعلميهم وزملائهم وأهاليهم؛ للمساهمة حتى وإن كان جزءاً بسيطاً من علاج مرضى السرطان تحديداً سرطان الثدي.

بدأنا نحضر مقطعاً توعوياً بمشاركة مجموعة من الطلاب والطالبات، لنشر الوعي بضرورة الفحص المبكر لسرطان الثدي سواء للنساء أو للرجال، وقد تلقينا دعماً كبيراً من قبل جميع المعلمين والمعلمات وزملائنا الأعزاء، فكانت مديرة المدرسة مي القسوس الداعم الرئيسي لهذه الحملة فهي من كانت تباشر بالسؤال عن عملنا في هذا المشروع الممتلىء بالأمل والأصرار. وبعد الإنتهاء من المقطع المصور، تم عرضه في المسرح أمام مجموعة من الطلبة والمعلمات والمعلمين وتم نشره على صفحة المدرسة على (الفيسبوك). ولم تقتصر أفكارنا على عمل مقطع مصور لنشر التوعية فقط بل قمنا بإحضار سعادة العين القاضي تغريد حكمت، الناجية من مرض السرطان وتحديداً سرطان الثدي، وكانت قصة سعادتها ملهمة للحاضرين جمعيهم ممّا أعطانًا دافعاً للصمود والإصرار على الحياة، فهي بكلّ فخر مثال للمرأة العربية الناجحة والمكافحة.

واستضفنا أيضاً الأستاذة علياء خير من مؤسسة الحسين للسرطان التي ساهمت في نشر الوعي بضرورة الكشف المبكر لسرطان الثدي، وكان أغلب الحاضرين لهذه المبادرة معلمات شعرنا من أسئلتهن بخوفهن الكبير من هذا المرض ولكن وراء هذا الخوف الكبير ثقة انبثقت لحضور هذه المحاضرة التوعوية، وكان هنالك مجموعة من الطلاب والطالبات الذين كانوا مثالاً للمستمع المميز والمحاور اللبق. فكان لتلك المحاضرتين وقع كبير في نفوس الحاضرين الذين أدركوا أهمية الكشف المبكر عن سرطان الثدي.

شكراً من القلب إلى القلب لكلّ من ساهم وشارك بنجاح هذه الأعمال المفعمة بالحياة.

A Tribute to the Dead Sea Angels...

"HOLD ON TO THE EDGE!" They kept yelling. "YALLA, YOU CAN DO IT!"

I tried, I really did... I tried with *all* my might, but it was no use. I was failing to keep my head above the watery grave that wished to swallow us all. My tiny feet wrestled with the slippery mud, the evil water was beating my face *so* hard... my breaths were agonizingly painful and awfully short... my small and slim body was being swept away by the unforgiving, rocky flood that came by surprise, I was too far away from the edge... it was just impossible, I wasn't ready for it... none of us were, I wasn't strong enough nor fast enough... none of us were. It all happened in just a few seconds... I found myself down in the depths of the stinging waters of the Dead Sea, heavy waves crashing over me. I knew that this was the end for me, *still*... I battled against my fate... thinking about my Mama and Baba, waiting for me to come home. I shouldn't have fought... I shouldn't have fought against my fate.

I just made it worse; I was gulping down *terrifying* amounts of *cold*, *salty*, *slimy* water... *trying* to breathe but choking instead... the seawater flooding down into my lungs... blood pounding behind my eyes. My salty tears now mixing with the even saltier water... my panic started to fade into numbness, my heartbeat slowed down increasingly... I saw the glistening of the moonlight dancing on the water above as I sunk even deeper... it was *mocking* me, mocking how *helpless* I was. It didn't matter anymore... I saw the exit but no longer had the strength to survive.

My mind was going blank... my heart was begging to give up its battle... my body shut down and froze altogether... and death lurked around the corner. It was too much... I decided to give into the darkness and let the water take me.

The last thing I remember before slipping away was nothing but pain.
