University is the first word that comes to mind when thinking about high school. Lots of time is spent thinking about grades, exams, and extracurriculars. Everyone wants to appear impressive to universities. This summer, I got accepted into the Harvard Summer School Program which is for students in grades 10, 11, and 12.

This program allows high school students to take college courses that count for university. You take 8 credit hours, which is usually two fourcredit courses or one 8 credit course. At the end of the course, you do finals. It is not something to be taken lightly; it teaches independence and many skills you need for college.

It is not a summer camp; the grades you receive will be used once you officially attend university. The acceptance rate is less than 50 percent. For seven weeks I was forced to depend on myself completely.



Living alone was probably the biggest shock; however, I'm grateful to have experienced it now; making it easier to adapt in the future. I also met with very successful people, who have PhDs from Harvard, professors, and admissions staff. I learned a lot about what is expected of Ivy League applicants and would like to share this information for those who are interested in attending elite universities, and for those seeking to be successful within their areas of study anywhere.

The first and most important thing professor said to me was "don't try to plan your whole life out at the age of 16." This is what we are pressured do by schools. parents, and even what we say to ourselves. As much as I didn't want to admit it, it's what I needed to hear.



Changing your mind is fine. Not everything is going to go exactly as planned. However, this doesn't mean not to start thinking about your future and have some idea about which field you prefer.

Another key point is to be well-balanced and well-rounded, despite what you want to study. Every subject you take will be useful at one point or another. You obtain knowledge of certain subjects that many others don't know about. Do not take classes that are too focused on what you want. Being well-rounded will be of use in the future if you change your mind as well. For example, in my case, I want to study law; however, I'm also taking analysis, which is a scientific stream math class. I chose to take analysis because this will distinguish me within my field of study.

As for extracurricular activities, it is important to keep in mind that taking a hundred different activities is not needed nor desired. Be distinguished in only a few activities you are truly passionate about and claim some type of leadership role. It is not about how many cards you have but about how you play them.







Last but certainly not least, the basic skills we tend to ignore as we approach high school primarily because studying becomes more intense are also crucial, especially reading, writing, and speaking.

These three common skills really affect your application as you do interviews and write essays for university. In addition to having these skills in English, being bilingual, or even trilingual also increases your chances. However, to say bilingual means you can proficiently speak, read, and write both languages. Meaning if you were to use this language in the future you would be able to work in an environment where people only speak that language.

I can confidently say that applying to this program was the best choice I made regarding the future of my education. I earned an unbelievable amount of advice and knowledge which I would never have thought of before.

I benefited educationally and socially, gained skills, and pushed my thinking to limits I never thought I could be pushed to. I was set on the right pathway and now I know exactly what I want and how to achieve it.

The only thing that will drive motivation and self-discipline is ambition, which is essential in order to be successful regardless of where you want to go in your life. As we always hear, "if there is a will there is a way."

How to apply?



I found this program through the Harvard website, I knew I wanted to study in an Ivy League School, so I started researching at the beginning of tenth grade about types of programs. Additionally, I had heard of the three-week focused summer program online. Once I opened the website I found the seven-week program which I knew I wanted to do the second I opened it. To apply you must write four short essays, with specific prompts. You must also submit transcripts from your last 1.5 to 2 years of school, as grades are largely taken into consideration.

Did NOS-MUN'22 actually "Bite the Bullet"? This year's theme was (Bite the Bullet). You may wonder what that means. As mentioned by the Head of Conference Johnny Hazboun. it is: "when someone decides to do something difficult or unpleasant that one has been putting off or hesitating to do," which represents the past two years perfectly.



The conference itself began as usual with the opening ceremony, unfortunately, there was no guest speaker due to Covid precautions, and it was aired as a Livestream to all committees. Many of the secretariat team members and the presidents gave touching speeches to kick off the conference and honour those who worked so hard to make it happen, in addition to getting some closure; as for some it was their last.

As Rahmeh Sharaab, the President of UNODC, mentioned when asked how she felt about her last NOS-MUN, she said: "I used to think that the former presidents used to exaggerate, but now as I'm in their shoes, I feel extremely sad that I'm leaving this part of my life, knowing that I won't attend another NOS-MUN again."

This clearly shows what these annual conferences mean to those attending them. They create a sense of pride, responsibility, and confidence for young minds to learn about political topics and share their ideas on such important issues. Usually, in our homes we are told not to discuss politics as it includes sensitive topics that can create many disagreements if not debated in the right manner.

That's exactly what NOS-MUN offers students; it gives youth the right to express their opinion and teaches them how to do so in the correct way and exposes them to the truth of the world we are living in, rather than the "la-la land" we assume we're in.

In this year's conference, the topics were rather controversial and extremely important to discuss. Whether in the courts where they were solving unresolved cases, or in the committees such as UNODC, which I attended, and where we discussed the narco-state in Syria and the judicial system in Belarus, and to be honest, it was an eye-opener. For example, Syria is not even a 3-hour car ride from us and we had no clue that they are currently developing a narco-state.

To conclude, this conference was truly one to remember; it proposed creative solutions to world problems, offered an escape from reality to students from their school and family life, and made them truly feel a sense of responsibility and achievement.




Remember, as we work to create light for each other, we naturally light our own way.








- NOS ALUM & FOUNDER OF EVOLVE MAJD MUNA
